About the Workshop

This 3-day introductory workshop focuses on the behavioral approach to teaching communication skills to children with autism and other developmental disabilities. This approach is based on B.F. Skinner's analysis of verbal behavior and the research of Michael, Sundberg, Partington, and others. Through many video tape demonstrations and his own verbal behavior, Dr. Carbone will illustrate the teaching procedures designed to increase spontaneous language and to develop conversational skills.

Participants in this workshop will learn:

- how to reduce problem behavior in everyday situations.
- how to develop and maintain cooperation during intensive teaching;
- how to identify reinforcers;
- how to reduce learner errors;
- how to maintain the pace of instruction;
- how to mix and vary demands;
- how to use fluency;
- how to intersperse tasks;
- how to use discrete trial training both in the natural environment and during intensive teaching sessions.
- how to record data and use it to make program decisions;
- how to select the most appropriate form of communication for the child;
- how to select the communication responses and supporting skills that should be taught first;
- how to conduct a behavioral language assessment using the Assessment of Basic Language and Learning Skills (ABLLS);
- how to identify the primary verbal behavior classes and how to teach them;
- how to teach social skills;

About the Presenter

Dr. Carbone is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst with over 30 years of experience designing learning environments for persons with autism and development disabilities. He is currently visiting professor in the Behavioral Education doctoral program at Simmons College in Boston, MA. His teaching responsibilities have included courses in applied behavior analysis and verbal behavior. His behavior analytic research has been published in several peer-reviewed journals including School Application of Learning Theory, Education and Treatment of Children, Journal of Special Education Technology, Journal of Corrective and Social Psychiatry, The Analysis of Verbal Behavior (2007), and Speech Language Pathology and Applied Behavior Analysis. Dr. Carbone currently serves on the editorial review boards of two peer-reviewed journals; the Journal of Early Intensive Behavioral Intervention and Speech Language Pathology and Applied Behavior Analysis. He is the developer and presenter of a series of workshops on teaching verbal behavior to children with autism based upon B.F. Skinner's analysis of verbal behavior.
